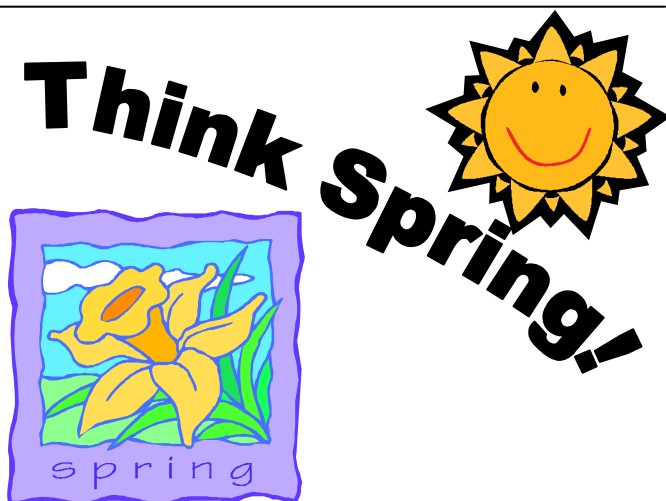
Future of Former Theaters to Be Discussed at April Meeting

Ice Cream Social to Be Held June 1st

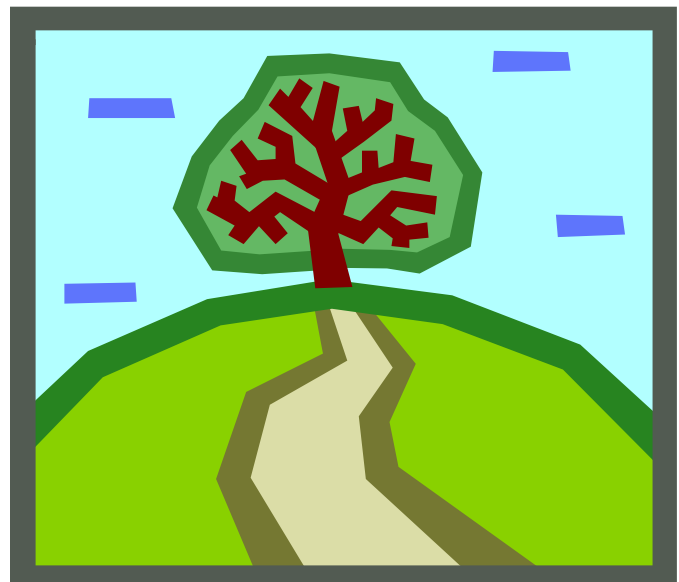
