Three Resolutions Presented at March General Membership Meeting

The Board of Directors presented three resolutions to the General Membership at the March meeting. They are as follows:

It is hereby resolved, that the Association establish a Centennial Fund to be used for the 100th Carnival to be held in 2007 and the GBIA Centennial Celebration to be held in 2008. A Centennial Committee shall be appointed by the president. The Committee shall submit a projected budget for use of the fund to the Board of Directors for approval. This fund shall terminate after the Centennial Celebration in 2008 and any unused funds shall be added to the Association's savings. This fund will be funded by a line item in the annual budget and any funds transferred from the Community Beautification and Improvement Fund and the Light Rail Fund . **It is hereby resolved**, that the Community Beautification and Improvement Fund is hereby terminated and all funds remaining in that account be transferred to the Centennial Fund. **It is hereby resolved**, that the Light Rail Fund is hereby terminated and all funds remaining in that account be transferred to the Centennial Fund. These resolutions will be voted on at the April 10th General meeting.
